April 30, 2017**

Calvary Baptist Church Chairman Jeff Rheingans called the meeting to order and prayed.

Call to Order: Jeff Rheingans called the meeting to order and opened with prayer.

Meeting Minutes: Cheri Jones read the Minutes from the 2016 Annual Report.

John Witte made a motion to approve the minutes.

Wes Smith seconded the motion.

Motion passed.

Chairman's Report: Jeff Rheingans thanked everyone for participation in various ministries. He has been Chairman for 3 years and therefore stepping down. Jeff Rheingans thanked the other Board members who are leaving which include Cheri Jones (Clerk), Cheri Tuckett (Financial Secretary), Lenny Jones (Steward), Tom Bacon and John Witte (Deacons). Jeff stated that in year's passed, the budget for evangelism had not always been used. This year it was and that made him happy.

Eric thanked Jeff for his leadership and thanked Lenny for keeping up snow blowing.

Anna thanked all the Board members and the Deacons and Deaconesses for an amazing job.

Church Survey Report: Jeff Rheingans stated there were 70 surveys handed out and 37 were returned. Jeff and Harlow Anderson compiled the surveys, averaged the scores and typed up a condensed version of the comments. He stated people tried to be honest, a few were long, therefore condensed. He said if you don't see 'our comment, contact him. The Board has not yet had to time to review and discuss the results. The Board tries to work with people and will give prayer and consideration as to the direction the church is wanting to go.

Treasurers Report: Gary Robertson accepted being Treasurer when Brian Dempcy was unable to complete Brian's term and to continue for an additional full term. Gary directed everyone to the treasurer's report, reviewed the various balances and answered any questions. Individual sections were explained and discussed. The Ken Davis event costs and incomes are listed separately. The General Fund Checking Balance as of 3/31/17 is \$7,357.10. Total Savings and checking balance is \$20,697.18.

Financial Secretary Report: Cheri Tuckett explained what her responsibilities as Financial Secretary have been. She counts the money in the offering, designates specific donations that are given to certain causes. The Building Fund is currently \$10,193.82. Cheri explained when that balance reaches \$11,000, \$10,000 is transferred into savings. The BGC Cornerstone Fund currently has a balance of \$46,697.11.

Dee Rheingans made a motion to accept the Financial Secretary Report as submitted.

Joanie Crolius seconded the motion.

The motion passed.

Mission Report: Jill Wittnebel presented the missions report. She stated that much of the information is confidential. Some of the missionaries have requested that information not be sent via email due to confidentiality. She respects that request. She stated if anyone wants more information, they can contact her. Calvary Baptist Church gives 16% of the general offerings to Missions. There are three Missions families that Calvary Baptist Church currently supports, as well as Praise FM, Converge Worldwide, and Converge North Central. The church generally issues \$500 to Big Stone Camp for Christ and some one-time gifts were issued as listed in the report. There is currently \$5,100 set aside for the next mission trip.

Worship 2017: It was mentioned that the survey results showed mixed opinions regarding the worship team, but overall, the congregation seems satisfied. Ben and Krishana Dempcy have moved away as have Brian Dempcy and Steve Kennedy. Anna Spickelmier is now leading worship once a month; Chris Werpy has joined the singing team.

Youth Board Report: Eric expressed thanks to Joe and Shelly Staffki, Nicole Siedschlag, Naomi Dempcy, Dee Rheingans and Josh Amland and Angie Amland for their work with various age levels of youth and children. The District Blitz trip to Duluth was a big success. 7 students attended and each had a positive message to say about their experience. Pastor Phil from Dawson Covenant Church has been a good youth leader and teacher. Joint efforts in leading the teens has been very positive! Eric stated that the church is the "greatest single hope for the world; it points people to Jesus!"

King's Kids: Dee Rheingans stated there has most generally been 6 children attending. They play a game, have "get acquainted" questions and the kids seem to enjoy it. They are 4th, 5th, and 6th Graders. God is working with these kids. They are utilizing a program titled "Group". Dee thanked Josh Amland for his help.

Pastor Eric's Report:

Church Survey: Pastor Eric is encouraged about the results of the survey. Jeff Rheingans and Harlow Anderson compiled the results. The average scores were shared and comments were printed out and shared. Eric stated none of the average scores were less than a rating of 3, most were 4 and 5. Pastor Eric shared some of his lower scores included length of sermon which scored 4.31 and sermons provide answers for life's problems scored 4.17. Pastor Eric would like to accept suggestions/requests from the congregation for future sermon topics. The Survey scored average or better for the questions regarding the Board. The Board plans to communicate more. Pastor Eric hopes that the congregation will grow in trust. The general consensus regarding activities was just right. Pastor Eric plans to have a Board Member retreat to further discuss the survey results and make plans on what direction they hope to lead the church.

Ken Davis event: Pastor Eric stated it was successful. We were able to speak about Jesus in front of 833 people. No one came to the prayer room and we have not had new visitors because of the event, however, God heard our prayers. He provided the funds and the workers needed to host the event, which was a huge undertaking for a small church. We've gained recognition in the community and we've grown in many other ways.

The Total Income from the Ken Davis event: \$19,789.50

The Total Expenses from the Ken Davis event: \$20,209.82

Difference of \$420.32 is Amazing!

Jeff added a Big Thanks to Pastor Eric, Jill Wittnebel, Paul Raymo, and Wes Smith for their work on the event.

Pastor Eric stated there is no place he would rather be than Calvary Baptist Church, Madison, Minnesota.

Pastor Eric stated that it had previously been suggested to set up Small Groups. That plan was discussed at a Board Meeting and was not pursued this past year. He summed up some of the last year's activities as hosting the Baccalaureate for the the high school graduates, leading the wedding which united Tate and Natalie (Witte) Collom, There were 50 children who attended VBS last summer. There was the Family Retreat at Big Stone Camp, several parties at the Power House, serving charity meals, delivering Meals on Wheels, consistently setting up for the Red Cross Blood Mobile, Christmas caroling at the nursing home, people marched across town praying for the Ken Davis event and much, much more. Pastor Eric stated "There is Nothing Else I'd rather be doing!"

New Business: Jeff Rheingans stated there are two members who no longer live here and need to be removed from the Membership roster. They are David and Angela Brown.

Kim Floren moved to remove David and Angela Brown from the roster.

Naomi Dempcy seconded the motion.

The motion passed.

Budget: Gary Robertson directed everyone to the Budget numbers column on the Treasurer's Report. He reviewed each category and explained the report. Ann Hoseck stated that she was still waiting for additional cupboards for the kitchen. They are needed where the extra chairs are currently stored. She also wants more of the white tables and wants to plan on spraying for bugs. Lenny Jones stated that the extra money which wasn't needed for the parking lot had been set aside for use in paying for the Ken Davis event (if needed) and if not needed, then put in the general fund. Jeff Rheingans said there had also been discussion about upgrading the acoustics in the sanctuary, possible paint and carpet and shingles. They are all more than 20 years old. All of these subjects will be discussed and decided by the Board.

Dee Rheingans made a motion to accept the budget.

Cheri Jones seconded the motion.

The motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT – MAY 2018



This past year here at Calvary began with a full-church survey that helped us identify strengths and weaknesses of our ministry. That data was then analyzed at length at a church board off-site retreat in August. Good time was spent in prayer and discussion at that retreat and we came up with a list of items to work on that we called the "Calvary Remodel Project."

The centerpiece of this project involved Calvary switching to a small group programming model. While the overall scores on our church survey had been quite encouraging there were some respondents who felt disconnected from people here. Even though we have offered Bible studies and 'fun nights' and other activities in the past to try to help people connect – that clearly had not worked for some.

A couple of years back I became aware of a book called Sticky Church that recounted the story of a church in California who, years ago, faced a similar issue. They defined the problem they faced in this way: "It doesn't matter how much work you are doing to get people in the front door of your church if they are just leaving out the back door a few months later." The solution they found for their problem was: sermon based small groups. Their move to running small group programming revolutionized the church – people were making connections with each other and forming lasting relationships and this largely closed their "back door". That church has multiplied exponentially since then.

Coming out of the prayer times we did at the retreat last August, the church board and I felt strongly that God was also leading us in this direction. And so, as you know, we have followed the model outlined in the Sticky Church book and launched a very similar program here. We are praying that the results will be the same and that you will all feel like you are finding meaningful, long lasting, relationships at Calvary!

There were other goals set for the "Calvary Remodel Project" as well. Some of these fit under the heading of "being certain that we do the things that we are doing with excellence and professionalism". This objective has led us into a facelift of the Power House building that is now about half completed. The purchase of a very nice church bus also falls under this category. There are other things yet to be accomplished in this area – like adding acoustical tiling to the sanctuary so that sound doesn't bounce

around as much during Sunday morning worship; we hope also someday to upgrade our computer system that shows the slides and videos; and additionally we would like to get some professional training for our sound techs.

The final area of the Calvary remodel revolved around me making some slight priority shifts in my work schedule and I continue to work with the board on these matters.

The wheels of churches often move slowly and that has been true here as well – many of our remodel items are yet to be accomplished - but I am pleased with what we have gotten done so far. The reactions I have heard regarding our small groups from those participating in them has been very encouraging!

Please know that ALL of this is done with the intention of advancing our goal of being good and effective ministers of God's Word both within our church body and within our community.

Thank YOU for all that each of you do to support these efforts! Nothing would happen without you because "We Are the Church!"

May God bless you and may He continue to bless and guide 'Calvary Baptist – Madison' in the coming year!

It's been another good year for Calvary efforts in youth programming. VBS was a big success again last summer – as it always is. And I am so thankful for Naomi Dempcy and helpers who provided another way for those younger kids to connect to Calvary and our message through Wednesday Warriors. I also continue to be so grateful for Dee Rheingans and her helpers for all their great work with the Wednesday night "King's Kids" program (4th through 6th grade). God has blessed that group year in and year out.

As I think most of you are aware, all of our youth programs here have more community kids coming to them than Calvary kids – what a wonderful opportunity this is! I am so thankful to our dedicated youth workers Joe and Shelly Stafki, Nicole Siedschlag, and youth pastor Phil Tolbert from DCC who runs the show. They have been excellent to work with!

As you have your personal prayer times over the coming months, would you remember to pray for all of our youth programs? Pray that God would guide the growth of the relationships these students are forming with the leaders and with each other and that He would leverage those relationships and all of the teaching that is given to move each of these young people into a lifelong path of discipleship to Jesus Christ!

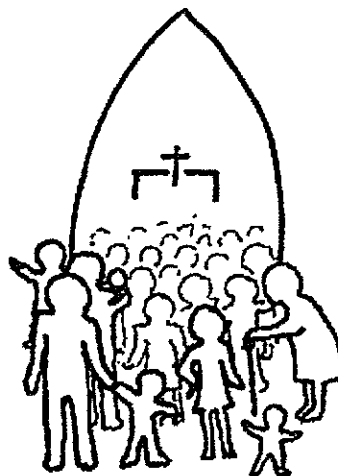
